

Physoc Celebrates Valentine's Day

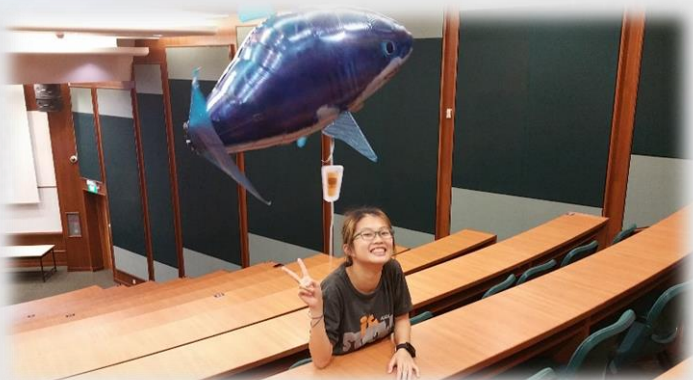
